### Letter from the President

We had a terrific Annual Banquet this year, and those of you who attended heard an excellent update from Bill Street, the President and CEO of the James River Association (JRA), on the health of the James River and the specific issues with its Shad populations. All of us have likely fished in the James, Virginia's longest river, or some of its many tributaries. Bill's program covered the many JRA programs and advocacy efforts that have taken the James from one of the nation's most polluted rivers to one of its most improved over the past four decades. We also had a very informative afternoon program presented by Alex McCrickard, Aquatic Education Coordinator for the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources, who talked about fishing opportunities in the Richmond area. We had an outstanding line up of silent auction and bucket raffle items, and those of you won them are going to enjoy some great days of fishing! Our thanks to the many FFV corporate sponsors and individuals who made these donations – please be sure to patronize them when you plan your fishing trips.

FFV is participating in some water conservation and fly fishing programs to serve a number of young people in the south Richmond Bellemeade Park area. This outstanding and comprehensive program has been developed largely through the efforts of FFV member Bob Argabright. After receiving a training program from the DWR, FFV had a session on September 18th at Bellemeade Park in which the young people seined the creek for aquatic insects and learned the basics of fishing. This was followed up with a second session on October 16 with a day of fly fishing at a private pond in Hanover County. A special shout out to the FFV members who helped with what will be an ongoing FFV partnership with Bellemeade Park – Bob Argabright, Tony Scrimizzi, Tom Mlot, Jim Mattson, Marvin Williams, Gary Green,, Art Girard, Tony Escalona, Andre Holcomb, Dale Clark, Gary Andrejco, Chuck Davis and David Skove. We look forward to additional activities and continual engagement with the young people of Bellemeade Park.

Fly Fishing Enthusiast,



# Salmon River New York



The Fly Fishers of Virginia (FFV)

was established in 1982 to promote the art of fly rod fishing; to foster good sportsmanship; and to promote conservation of the nation's natural resources.

During the year, six dinner meetings are occasions for informational programs pertaining to the many aspects of fly fishing and conservation activities. Programs are presented by international and local experts and celebrities in the fly fishing world, as well as knowledgeable FFV members.

Fishing trips are scheduled each year for cold water, warm water, and saltwater species.

Educational programs for members and the public, as well as seminars and workshops are scheduled periodically.

Fly tying classes are offered each winter: Beginning, Intermediate, or Advanced, depending on demand. Casting clinics are also available.

The club gives financial support to several conservation and fly fishing related organizations, including: James River Association; Wildlife Foundation of Virginia and special projects of the VDGIF; The Chesapeake Bay Foundation; Coastal Conservation Association, Project Healing Waters, Reel Recovery, Casting for Recovery, and The Brotherhood of the Jungle Cock and the CHMS Fly Fishing Club.
