

Letter from the President

Happy Spring! The dogwoods and azaleas are blooming, and Shad and Strippers are returning to our local waters. May the wind be mild or at least at your back as you cast for these amazing fish. Hopefully you will be enjoying getting out on the water fishing for your favorite species.

Thank you to all members that took time to fill out our member survey. The response was fantastic, my last update showed 112 responses. Our board will review responses at our upcoming April board meeting, and I will provide a recap at our May dinner meeting. Two questions received a majority positive response, our location at Hermitage CC, 89% yes, and our approach to addressing the rising cost of food, 81% yes.

Our March dinner meeting was well attended, and Capt. John Mauser spoke about his home waters in coastal North Carolina and the nearby Roanoke River for Shad and Strippers. See Robert Thomas' update on our May dinner speakers where we will have both a local and destination fishing focus.

Our Spring Mossy Creek fishing outings were well subscribed, and Dick Chapman is working on setting up fall trips with the Mossy Creek team. Survey feedback indicates a desire for more club fishing trips and our board will discuss how to engage more members willing to lead trips.

April is the time when the board reviews our annual donations to worthy organizations supporting our club purpose for advancing fly rod fishing, sportsmanship and conservation. Jon Arnold leads this effort for the club and will provide an update to our club's donations for 2023.

Conservation is an area that board member Millie Neagle is working to increase the club's opportunities to support, particularly with our local James River. Millie will update the club at our May diner meeting.

Dennis is the owner of Safaris Unlimited Adventures, is a NRA and National Sporting Clays Association certified shotgun instructor and a Master Instructor for the Baskerville Wingshooting School.

As an outfitter, Dennis has taken friends and soon to be friends on adventures around the world. Whether bird hunting in Argentina, fly fishing in Belize and South Africa or hunting Cape Buffalo in Zimbabwe the addiction to adventures, both big and small, is never quite satisfied.

The first fly fishing experience came early with a Pflueger fly rod with a wind up" automatic" reel chasing brim with popping bugs. Another passion was ignited! Jump ahead several decades and a friend "forced" him to take a trip to Mosquito Lagoon in Florida in which he could barely get the fly out of the boat on the first day. But, by day three he got two "nice cast" comments from the guide. Most recently, the passion has been tweaked just a bit to include fly fishing salt water flats.

Since then, Dennis has loved fly fishing in streams of South Africa for huge browns, the flats of Florida and Belize for bones, snook, tarpon and permit, the western streams of Virginia and West Virginia for trout and smallmouth, wet wading some of the famous streams of the West for browns, rainbows and cutthroat trout and local ponds and lakes for bream, bass and crappie. He is a recently retired pharmacist whose specialty for over 20 years has been the education and vaccination of international travelers.

Fly Fishing Enthusiast,









Mac Myers Rose River











The Fly Fishers of Virginia (FFV)

was established in 1982 to promote the art of fly rod fishing; to foster good sportsmanship; and to promote conservation of the nation's natural resources.

During the year, six dinner meetings are occasions for informational programs pertaining to the many aspects of fly fishing and conservation activities. Programs are presented by international and local experts and celebrities in the fly fishing world, as well as knowledgeable FFV members.

Fishing trips are scheduled each year for cold water, warm water, and saltwater species.

Educational programs for members and the public, as well as seminars and workshops are scheduled periodically.

Fly tying classes are offered each winter: Beginning, Intermediate, or Advanced, depending on demand. Casting clinics are also available.

The club gives financial support to several conservation and fly fishing related organizations, including: James River Association; Wildlife Foundation of Virginia and special projects of the DWR; The Chesapeake Bay Foundation; Coastal Conservation Association, Project Healing Waters, Reel Recovery, Casting for Recovery, and The Brotherhood of the Jungle Cock and the CHMS Fly Fishing Club.
