Letter from the President

As we approach year end 2023 and prepare for our final dinner meeting November 15th, there is much to be thankful for. Our club is financially sound, we have settled into our new venue for club dinner meetings, we have added new members and our members in waiting list continues to grow. Thanks to excellent attendance at our dinner meetings and support for our fundraising efforts our board again authorized \$7,000 to be donated to ten worthy organizations whose missions align with our club's founding purpose: "To promote the art of fly rod fishing; to foster good sportsmanship; and to promote conservation and preservation of the nation's natural resources including reclamation of environmentally degraded waters and watercourses." In addition to money contributions our club continues to support several organizations with volunteer hours, Project Healing Waters, Reel Recovery, Boy's to Men, Bellemeade Kids, James River Association are some of the organizations receiving volunteer support from FFV.

After receiving outstanding response to our membership survey the board of directors has acted to continue where we received affirmation (dinner meeting location) as well as address opportunities identified. Our women's fishing group has re-started, fly tying and casting clinics have taken place with more scheduled, and work has begun on refreshing our club's web site.

We made some progress with members led fishing outings; opportunity still exists. Cost challenges are ongoing as we addressed the increase in food and food service prices by adjusting our menu selection and format to keep down the amount passed on to membership. The board decided to keep our traditional menu for the annual banquet, realizing the cost for a reservation would be a concern. To offset this the board authorized a no charge event funded from our treasury allowing members to meet and socialize as well as swap some equipment. We intend to offer a similar event in 2024. We anticipate cost challenges to continue in 2024. We want to offer a quality speaker menu, which will result in higher reimbursements. We want to continue with donations to worthy organizations. We have been notified food prices will increase starting in January 2024.

Members will receive an email notification of annual dues and payment process. Our membership dues have not changed since 2009. The board has voted to increase our annual dues to \$85 for 2024. We appreciate your continued support of Fly Fishers of Virginia.

During the year, six dinner meetings are occasions for informational programs pertaining to the many aspects of fly fishing and conservation activities. Programs are presented by international and local experts and celebrities in the fly fishing world, as well as knowledgeable FFV members.

Fishing trips are scheduled each year for cold water, warm water, and saltwater species.

Educational programs for members and the public, as well as seminars and workshops are scheduled periodically.

Fly tying classes are offered each winter: Beginning, Intermediate, or Advanced, depending on demand. Casting clinics are also available.

The club gives financial support to several conservation and fly fishing related organizations, including: James River Association; Wildlife Foundation of Virginia and special projects of the DWR; The Chesapeake Bay Foundation; Coastal Conservation Association, Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing, Reel Recovery, Casting for Recovery, and The Brotherhood of the Jungle Cock.
